Our Mission:

The Cohort Project exists to assist the local church in its universal mission to equip the saints and advance the gospel, to the glory of God.

How We Seek To Accomplish This:

Our primary aim is to assist the local church by coming alongside its leaders. Ministry can be a hostile, lonely environment that, without relief, leads to burnout. Recent studies claim that nearly 40% of pastors are currently considering leaving the ministry. It is our desire to step into the lives of pastors/shepherds/elders, providing much-needed support so that they and their church bodies can continue to do faithful ministry.

We desire to offer this **free of charge** to those churches we partner with, by raising the necessary funds through private donors and other churches who believe in this mission.
